"We both visited the institute as per order where Govt building and campus is shared with NCC department of Law Sciences The building has a common library for all courses including pharmacy The university claims to have Pharmacy labs in Girls hostel converted premises which aprox 50 mtr but they showed inability to open any lab and show equipments saying the Principal has taken keys with him School has no class rooms to show We declare that college dont have required infrastructure and faculty."

- 1.3 In view of above, it was decided to seek compliance of the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report within 7 days.
- 1.4 It was further decided to take action in anticipation of comments from the EC members on the EC minutes.

 - c. Arrangement of Instruments machine room, cleaning of labs, was not maintained properly during Inspection.
 - d. FT-IR, flame photometer was not available.
- 2.3 In view of above, it was decided to seek compliance of the deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report within 7 days.

- 3.1 The latest information on record was placed and considered.
- 3.2 EC noted that institution doesn't have requisite teaching staff for M.Pharm (Pharmacology) as per prescribed M.Pharm Regulations.
- 3.3 In view of above, it was decided not to consider appeal regarding restoration of M. Pharm (Pharmacology) seats
- 3.4 It was further decided to take action in anticipation of comments from the EC members on the EC minutes.

<u>02.419.004:</u> Consideration of joint inspection reports and status of joint inspection of PCI and BTE in Uttar Pradesh institutions.

- 4.1 The latest information on record including present status of joint inspection of PCI and BTE was placed and considered.
- 4.2 It was noted that
 - a) 79 institutions have not applied to PCI during 2024-2025 academic session.
 - b) 12 institutions are not found in PCI record.
 - c) some inspections are pending due to want of panel.
 - d) 370 inspection reports received.
 - e) some BTE inspectors did not join the joint inspection with PCI.
 - f) in the year 2024-2025 academic session Secretary BTE has forwarded a list of 1098 institutions for joint inspection with PCI, out of which 427 institutions had already filed court case against BTE in the year 2023-2024.
- 4.3 In view of above, EC decided as under
 - a) inform to BTE where institutions have not applied to PCI for 2024-2025 academic session.
 - b) institutions not found in PCI record be also inform to BTE.
 - c) in some institutions BTE inspectors not joined the PCI inspectors hence inspection was carried by PCI inspectors only.
- 4.4 The inspection report already reflected on EC portal. EC will give decisions through portal.
- 4.5 It was also decided to forward the list of 427 institutions to all EC members which had filed court case against BTE.

4.6 It was further decided to take action in anticipation of approval of the minutes from Hon'ble President.

02.419.005: Ratification of action taken letter dt. 8.10.2024 by Council in r/o Extension of approval of D.Pharm and B.Pharm course conducted at ABSS Institute of Technology, UP for running pharmacy courses on false and fabricated documents since 2019-reg.

- 5.1 The latest information on record including complaint received from Shri Dhananjay Vats was placed and considered.
- 5.2 It was decided to ratify the action taken by Council in conveying the decision letter dt.8.10.2024 with the approval of competent authority to institution.
- <u>02.419.006</u>: Consideration of Order dt.01.10.2021 in W.P. No. 1981 of 2021 and Order dt. 04.10.2024 in CLCON 79 of 2022 passed by Hon'ble High Court of Uttkarkhand, Nainital in the matter of Kukreja Institute of Pharmacy vs. PCI.

(File No. PCI-5216/2021)

- 6.1 The latest information on record was placed and considered.
- 6.2 It was noted that
 - a) Kukreja Institute of Pharmacy was approved conditionally to conduct the course for 1st year for 2017-2018 for D. Pharm and B. Pharm subject to appointment of Principal and teaching staff and submission of Staff Declaration Form (SDF) for the same. However, the institution had failed to submit full compliance (appointment of Principal, teaching staff, equipment, labs. etc.) with documentary evidence and therefore the approval is deemed to be withdrawn in view of conditional approval granted by the PCI.
 - b) Also, the institution had also failed to submit the Standard Inspection Form (SIF-C) in 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 with the requisite statutory documents.
 - c) The 111th CC has decided that:

"there is a break in the approval in terms of no admissions, such institutions be considered as new institutions covered under Council's moratorium and not to consider for approval."

d) Thereafter, the 112th C.C. held on 10.06.2021 has decided as under:

In view of above, it was decided to reject the application for D. Pharm and B. Pharm course.
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- e) The institution had preferred a Writ Petition (W.P. No. 1981 of 2021) before the Hon'ble Court of Uttarakhand, Nainital, the Hon'ble Court vide Order dated 01.10.2021 directed the PCI to consider the application of the institution herein for approval of B.Pharm and D. Pharm Course as per rules prevalent for granting of recognition. It was also noted that the Council's lawyer could not appear before the Hon'ble Court and therefore, the Council was not able to place some material facts which are necessary for proper adjudication of the matter. A copy of the order dt. 01.10.2021 is annexed as **Annexure-2**.
- f) The institution had also filed a Contempt case CLCON 79 of 2022 wherein the Court vide its Order dt. 04.10.2024had again observed that despite direction issued by Writ Court to Pharmacy Council of India to take decision on petitioner's application within one month, no decision has been taken so far. A copy of the order dt. 04.10.2024 is annexed as **Annexure-3**.
- g) The last date for consideration of application for the academic-session 2021-2022 was 30.06.2021 which was already over and therefore PCI could not have granted approval as it would be in contempt of Supreme Court direction in Parshavanath Charitable Trust &Anr. Vs. All India Council for Tech. Edu and Ors. (Order dt. 07.05.2021 in MA No. 599/2021 in C.A. No. 9048/2012). A copy of the Order dt. 07.05.2021 is annexed as **Annexure-4.**
- h) Also, the institution applied for the 2024-2025 academic session. The Council had conducted the scrutiny of the application and conveyed deficiencies based on the SIF report to the institution on 15.05.2024 and 20.06.2024 and the institution was provided ample time i.e. till 30.06.2024 to submit the compliance, however, the institution again submitted the old documents over the PCI portal which were invalid.
- i) Also, till date, the institution failed to submit full compliance and SIF as per the requirement of the Pharmacy Act and Education Regulations made thereunder.
- 6.3 In view of above, after due deliberation and discussion, the EC decided
 - a) Decision letter for 2021-2022 academic-session:
